

When you are supervising children the following points will help:-

Always treat children with respect and in the same sort of way that you would expect them to treat you.

Be friendly towards them.

Avoid shouting... if you speak normally they will have to be quiet in order to hear what you are saying.

Give clear instructions in as much detail as is appropriate.

Don't be afraid to quietly and calmly correct a child that is misbehaving but try to avoid physical contact with the children.

If you are helping with dressing or undressing for PE encourage the child to do as much as possible for themselves. If in doubt, speak to the nearest member of staff.

Encourage the children with praise whenever possible.


Do not let the children become 'silly' or over-friendly with you. They must learn to behave socially towards adults in school. Encourage them to be polite to one another.

You will sometimes see children being disciplined. Please be aware that you will not always know what has happened previously, or the warnings that have been given.

If you are concerned about a child for any reason, have a word with the class teacher or the head teacher - do not speak directly to the parents of the child or any other parents.


This class teacher will do this.

Arrival and Departure

It is important that you sign in at the office on your arrival and sign out on your departure.

This is part of our Health and Safety Regulations as we need to be aware of who is on site at all times.

We would also ask that you wear a visitor's badge. This is a further way ensuring that all adults on site are accounted for. Please realise that if you are not wearing your badge then someone should ask you, "Why not?"

ESSENTIAL INFORMATION

The children need to ask their teacher before they go to the toilet.
