

Arrangements for Reception children beginning school in September 2018

Dear Parents/Carers,

It is our policy, in common with other primary schools, to gradually build up to full time school attendance for all children beginning our school. This enable us to support a gentle and effective transition into school for your children. School can be overwhelming for young children, and you will notice that although your child will be excited, they will be more tired than usual as they become familiar with a new, larger environment and cope with new experiences and routines.

The programme of entry for this autumn will be as follows:

Date	Time in school	Children in school
Thurs 6 th , Friday 7 th ,	All children will be visited at home by teachers and	
Monday 10 th September	teaching assistant. Each home visit will last 20 minutes.	
Tuesday 11 th September	9:00am -11:30am	Children born between April 1st and August 31st visit school.
	1:00pm – 3:00pm	Children born between September 1 st and March 31 st visit school.
For the rest of the week 12 th , 13 th 14 th September	8:40am-12:00pm	All children are given the opportunity to stay for the morning session.
Week beginning Monday 17 th September	8:40am-1:10pm	All children are given the opportunity to stay for lunch in school.
Monday 24 th September	School closed for staff training	
For the rest of the week 25 th , 26 th 27 th September	8:40am-3:00pm	All children are given the opportunity to stay in school full time from now onwards

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It is important to be guided by your child as he/she settles into school. If he/she appears not to be ready to stay all day and would benefit from spending some time at home in the afternoon, please speak to us. Likewise, if we feel your child is coping well with morning sessions but not ready for a full school day we will discuss a more gradual entry for your child.

We want every child to have the best possible experience as they begin school and so develop the positive attitudes that we aim to foster in all our pupils. A happy and settled start to their first year in school is vital for these attitudes to develop.

We look forward to meeting you and your child in school.
