It is always encouraging for the children when they see how much their parents and families take an active interest in their work and learning and it re-enforces the view that **school and home work in partnership together** to ensure that children achieve to their full potential. In 2016-2017 we have made some big changes to how teachers assess the children in school. Each week teachers work to update their assessment information and we carry out more formal assessments every half term to track progress. These changes are all part of our continuing work to allow all of our children to make the best possible progress during their time with us, which can be seen in the fabulous outcomes this year for our Year 6 pupils. **Well done all.**

Collectively we saw the following results for our Year 6 pupils:

- 92% of our children achieved the expected standard in Reading: **21% above National.**
- 100% achieved the expected standard in Maths <u>25%</u> above National.
- 92% achieved the expected standard in Grammar, Punctuation and Spelling **15% above National.**

I am sure you will take pleasure in sharing and celebrating your child's achievements together and I hope that we will see you at the **Summer Event this evening**. I'm sure, in this heat, that a dip in the pool will be welcomed.
