Lookout Club

We are fortunate at our school to have the facilities and the staff to be able to provide 'wrap around care' at our school from 8am until 6pm Monday to Friday during term time. Our school runs both an early morning breakfast club, and an after school club. It is open to pupils of all ages who attend our school.

Breakfast club opens at 7.40 am and breakfast is served until 8.15am, children who attend are then supervised until the start of the school day. **Lookout Afterschool Club starts at 3pm** and runs until 6pm. Children are provided with light refreshments and there is a wide range of activities on offer. Both clubs are run by members of our school staff, who have undergone First Aid and Child Protection Training, and who provide a friendly and relaxed atmosphere.
