# Snow Closure—It's that time of Year again!

There is a definite change in the weather this week, as children come into school sensibly bundled up, **especially for Nature Detectives sessions in the woods**, well done parents!

Children in all classes are encouraged to play and learn using our outdoor environments. - We will place a notice on the school website by 7.30am.
- We will **email all families**—you should receive an email before 8 a.m. to let you know each day that we are closed. (Keep us updated with your contact details. If you have the Eschools app on your smart phone a message will come to your phone ensure that your notification settings are turned on
- We will also **inform BBC Radio Cambridgeshire** and details will appear on the County Council website school closure list.
- It is unlikely that we will answer any phone calls into school please do not use this usual contact method.
